Murtagh – is essential reading but its greatest use is for his diagnostic framework, diagnostic triads and red flags

Medicine Today is a journal you can get for free – too much detail for the exams, but good articles

Australian Medicine Handbook – introductory pages in each section are a great way to revise management.

A good dermatology textbook is handy some examples are Fitzpatrick's Colour Atlas and Synopsis of Clinical Dermatology; Roxburgh's Common Skin Disease; "Skin Disease Diagnosis and Treatment" by TP Habif
